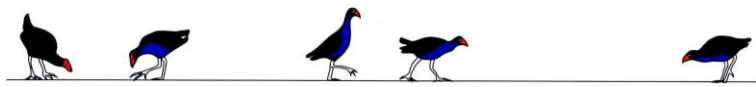

<u>Enhancing our Public Spaces Grant;</u> Mosaics on Toilets and Shelter Shed. Annabelle provided an outline of the proposed activities and suggested design elements. Sample packs of donated tiles from Beaumont's displayed and provided to budding mosaic artists for paving design.	Annabelle	
<u>Acacia Saligna (woody weed) eradication;</u> Poses major Fire Risk to the town. Identification and suggested control measures for the eradication of these weeds around the township.	Carole	
<u>Urban Biodiversity Street Tree Replacement Project;</u> Approved Community Environment Grant for removal of Acacia Saligna on Bayview Drive will start once the seeds have dropped, which is expected during the next month. The revegetation using native species identified in the council guidelines needs some discussion and consultation with Bayview Road residents to select suitable and available plant options. Plants will be provided by CBNEG under the grant. Residents are encouraged to nurture & maintain plantings. Discussion of the relevant portion of the Clayton Bay Foreshore Master Plan, and this small part of the overall plan. Volunteer involvement needed. Discussion of reed removal planned soon by the council along the oval and recreation shoreline.	Carole	Completion August 2018
